HJR01-1031 by Representative(s) King, Alexander, Bacon, Berry, Cadman, Clapp, Crane, Daniel, Dean, Fairbank, Fritz, Groff, Hefley, Hoppe, Jahn, Johnson, Kester, Larson, Lee, Mace, Miller, Mitchell, Nunez, Paschall, Rhodes, Rippy, Romanoff, Schultheis, Scott, Sinclair, Smith, Snook, Spence, Spradley, Stafford, Stengel, Swenson, Webster, Weddig, White, Williams S., Williams T., Witwer; also Senator(s) Pascoe, Andrews, Arnold, Cairns, Epps, Evans, Gordon, May, Teck--Concerning Colorado's support of George W. Bush's plan to create charter states to access federal funds.

WHEREAS, President George W. Bush has proposed bipartisan education reform to transform the federal government's role in assisting states in improving student academic achievement; and

WHEREAS, The President's plan consolidates, streamlines, and reduces federal requirements while placing student achievement first, rewarding states that raise student achievement; and

WHEREAS, The President's plan makes federal education funding more flexible by creating a charter option to allow states to enter into a charter agreement with the Secretary of Education that offers freedom from current requirements on categorical grant programs in return for a state's submission of a five-year performance agreement to the Secretary of Education establishing specific goals for and methods of measuring increased student performance; and

WHEREAS, The President's plan would require states to be subject to accountability for improving student achievement; and

WHEREAS, It is in the best interests of the students and parents of Colorado for the State of Colorado to support this plan because it has the potential to free the State of Colorado from unnecessary requirements while allowing the State of Colorado much needed flexibility in selecting the means for achieving academic improvement; and

WHEREAS, The President's plan to create charter states will become a source of federal legislation; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

That the General Assembly of the State of Colorado supports the charter state option in the President's plan and requests and encourages the United States Congress to adopt such legislation.

Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Joint Resolution be delivered to all of the members of the Colorado Congressional delegation.
