- (3) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the stationary sources control fund created in section 25-7-114.7 (2) (b), Colorado Revised Statues, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of public health and environment, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, the sum of thirtysix thousand ninety-nine dollars (\$36,099) and 0.7 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act.".
