Such failure shall not affect the validity of the deed of trust foreclosure or of any proceedings conducted in connection therewith.

SECTION 2. 5-1-301 (15) (c), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

5-1-301. General definitions. In addition to definitions appearing in subsequent articles, as used in this code, unless the context otherwise requires:

(15) (c) Unless the loan is made subject to this code by an agreement described in section 5-2-501 and except as provided with respect to the disclosure described in section 5-3-101, debtors' remedies described in section 5-5-204, and powers and functions of the administrator under part 1 of article 6 of this title, NOTICE TO COSIGNERS AND SIMILAR PARTIES UNDER SECTION 5-3-105, NOTICE OF RIGHT TO CURE UNDER SECTION 5-5-110, AND CURE OF DEFAULT UNDER SECTION 5-5-111, "consumer loan" does not include a "loan primarily secured by an interest in land" as defined in subsection (26) of this section."

"(2) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FURTHER FINDS AND DECLARES THAT, IN ORDER TO ASSURE 41 THAT CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR CHILD CARE WORKERS ARE ACCURATE AND 42 COMPLETE, IT IS CRITICAL THAT THE STATE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT CONTINUE TO WORK WITH 43 OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT ENTITIES TO COMPLETE AND IMPLEMENT THE INTEGRATED 44 CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM IN A TIMELY MANNER AND CONSIDER THE 45 INTEGRATION OF MUNICIPAL RECORDS, INCLUDING THE COUNTY COURT RECORDS OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER, INTO SUCH SYSTEM.".

"amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW PARAGRAPH to read:";

line 22, after "IDENTIFIERS", insert "EXISTING ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT".

Page 5, strike lines 7 through 11.

Page 10, line 17, before "NOTWITHSTANDING", insert "(1)".

Page 11, after line 2, insert the following:

"(2) THE CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION NEED NOT INCLUDE A FINGERPRINT CHECK, BUT SHALL INCLUDE A COMPARISON SEARCH ON THE ICON SYSTEM AT THE STATE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT.".
