Appropriations

After consideration on the merits, the committee recommends that **SB01-035** be amended as follows and, as so amended be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend the Business, Labor, and Finance Committee amendment, as printed in Senate Journal, February 2, page 170, strike line 72, and substitute the following:

""**SECTION 2. Appropriation.** In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the distributive data processing fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of revenue, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, the sum of one hundred seven thousand two hundred four dollars (\$107,204) and 2.9 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act.

SECTION 3. Effective date - applicability. This act shall take effect upon passage. This act shall apply to specific ownership taxes due on or after August 1, 2000, and any titles required to be reissued, or taxable values reestablished under this act.".

Renumber succeeding section accordingly.".".

Page 171, strike lines 1 through 4.

Amend printed bill, page 1, line 107, strike "PRICE." and substitute "PRICE, AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.".

Appropriations

After consideration on the merits, the committee recommends that **SB01-073** be amended as follows and, as so amended be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend printed bill, page 4, strike line 17, and substitute the following:

"SECTION 5. 25-3.5-807 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

- **25-3.5-807.** Tobacco program fund created. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the tobacco program fund that shall consist of the moneys appropriated thereto pursuant to subsection (2) of this section. In addition, the state treasurer may credit to the fund any public or private gifts, grants, or donations received by the division for implementation of the program. The fund shall be subject to annual appropriation by the general assembly to the department for issuance of grants pursuant to this part 8; EXCEPT THAT, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY ALSO APPROPRIATE MONEYS FROM THE FUND TO THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE TO PAY FOR THE RANDOM INSPECTION OF BUSINESSES THAT SELL CIGARETTES AND TOBACCO PRODUCTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-35-504 (3), C.R.S. In addition, the department may retain up to five percent of the amount annually appropriated from the fund for the actual costs incurred by the division and the state board in implementing the provisions of this part 8. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 24-36-114, C.R.S., all interest derived from the deposit and investment of moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Any unencumbered moneys appropriated from moneys received by the state pursuant to the master settlement agreement remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall be transferred to the tobacco litigation settlement trust fund created in section 24-22-115.5, C.R.S.
- **SECTION 6. Appropriation.** (1) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the tobacco program fund, created pursuant to section 25-3.5-807, Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of revenue, liquor enforcement division, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, the sum of three hundred twenty-one thousand six hundred thirty dollars (\$321,630) and 5.0 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of section 1 of this act.
 - (2) In addition to any other";

strike lines 21 through 24, and substitute the following:

"sum of one hundred fifty thousand nine hundred seventy-one dollars (\$150,971) and 2.5 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the implementation of the remaining portions of this act.

(3) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, to the department of law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, the sum of five thousand eight hundred sixty dollars (\$5,860), or so much thereof as may be necessary for the provision of legal services to the department of revenue related to the implementation of this act. Said sum shall be from cash funds exempt received from the department of revenue out of the appropriation made in subsection (1) of this section."
