1 **HB01-1198** by Representative(s) Dean; also Senator(s) Dyer  
 2 (Durango)--Concerning the circulation of a petition in  
 3 connection with an election, and, in connection therewith,  
 4 making it unlawful for a person to employ another person  
 5 to circulate a petition on either a paid or volunteer basis  
 6 without knowing or reasonably believing that the  
 7 circulator is legally qualified to vote in a political  
 8 subdivision in which the petition is being circulated,  
 9 eliminating the requirements that certain petition  
 10 circulators be registered electors and that the identifying  
 11 badge worn by a circulator of a statewide initiative and  
 12 referendum petition list the name of the circulator, and  
 13 modifying the information that must be provided in reports  
 14 on the payment of statewide initiative and referendum  
 15 petition circulators.  
 16
