9

10 I am filing with the Secretary of State House Bill 01-1007, "Concerning
11 Certain Transportation Related Agencies Involved with the Development
12 of Mass Transit Systems in the State." Therefore, this bill becomes state
13 law at 12:01 am on April 6. This letter sets forth my reasoning for letting
14 the bill become law without my signature.

15

16 As you know, HB 01-1007 requires state agencies and regional councils
17 to report their collaborative efforts to the Transportation Legislative
18 Review Committee. I am in favor of sharing information between
19 agencies, particularly when dealing with transportation matters. Under
20 my administration, the Colorado Department of Transportation and the
21 Regional Transportation District have worked in conjunction on transit
22 issues, particularly the southwest corridor and the southeast corridor
23 projects.

24

25 There is no doubt that cooperation is required to ensure that conflicting
26 or overlapping transit systems do not compete for precious funding
27 dollars. The Colorado Department of Transportation, under Colorado
28 law, is the lead agency on all transportation matters in the state. I,
29 therefore, believe that the Colorado Department of Transportation should
30 lead such coordination efforts.

31

32 Furthermore, I am concerned that the legislature is failing to recognize the
33 executive branch's role in coordinating transportation policy, particularly
34 since the legislature removed my appointees from the Transportation
35 Legislative Review Committee last year.

36

37 For these reasons, I am allowing HB 01-1007 to become law without my
38 signature.
