A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE IDENTIFICATION OF THE COUNTY OF VEHICLE**
102 **REGISTRATION ON LICENSE PLATES.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Requires the department of revenue, after consulting with the county clerks, to provide a durable and cost-effective means to prominently identify the county of registration on motor vehicle license plates unless a vehicle owner indicates on the registration application form that the owner does not want the county to be indicated.

2 **SECTION 1.** 42-3-113 (2) (b), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
3 amended to read:

4 **42-3-113. Number plates furnished - style - periodic reissuance.**

5 (2) (b) ~~If~~ THE DEPARTMENT SHALL, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH ITS
6 AGENTS, PROVIDE A DURABLE AND COST-EFFECTIVE MEANS TO
7 PROMINENTLY IDENTIFY THE COUNTY OF VEHICLE REGISTRATION ON ALL
8 number plates TO BE issued for AND DISPLAYED ON THE REAR OF vehicles

13 **SECTION 2. Effective date.** This act shall take effect October
14 1, 2001, unless a referendum petition is filed during the ninety-day period
15 after final adjournment of the general assembly that is allowed for
16 submitting a referendum petition pursuant to article V, section 1 (3) of the
17 state constitution. If such a referendum petition is filed against this act or
18 an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item,
19 section, or part, if approved by the people, shall take effect on the date of
20 the official declaration of the vote thereon by proclamation of the
21 governor.
