HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 01-1052

101 **CONCERNING THE RECOGNITION OF GIRLS' DAY IN COLORADO.**

1 WHEREAS, There are nearly one-half million girls in Colorado
2 making a positive difference in their families, schools, and communities;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, Girls are preparing to become educated, productive,
5 and self-reliant citizens; and

6 WHEREAS, Girls strengthen Colorado through their leadership
7 skills, creativity, and resourcefulness; and

8 WHEREAS, Opportunities available to girls are currently limitless;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, Girls reinforce the foundation of our communities by
11 preparing for meaningful careers in both traditional and nontraditional
12 fields; and

13 WHEREAS, Girls can expand their horizons by exploring careers
14 in the new economy and acquiring the necessary technical skills for a

14 2001, as Girls' Day in Colorado.
