



HOUSE RESOLUTION 01-1002

CONCERNING COMMITTEES OF REFERENCE IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

That Rule No. 25 (a), 25 (a.1), 25 (g), and 25 (k) (1) of the Rules of the House of Representatives are amended, and the said Rule No. 25 is further amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION, to read:

25. COMMITTEES

- (a) Committees of reference of the House shall be:
 - (1) Agriculture, Livestock, and Natural Resources.
 - (2) Appropriations.
 - (3) Business Affairs and Labor.
 - (4) CIVIL JUSTICE AND JUDICIARY.

- (5) CRIMINAL JUSTICE.
 - ~~(4)~~ (6) Education.
 - ~~(5)~~ (7) Finance.
 - ~~(6)~~ (8) Health, Environment, Welfare, and Institutions.
 - (9) INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY.
 - ~~(7)~~ Judiciary.
 - ~~(8)~~ (10) Local Government.
 - ~~(9)~~ (11) State, Veterans, and Military Affairs.
 - ~~(10)~~ (12) Transportation and Energy.
- (a.1) (1) The Committee on Legal Services shall be considered a committee of reference for any bill introduced pursuant to section 24-4-103 (8) (d), Colorado Revised Statutes. ~~1973~~
- (2) FOR PURPOSES OF DETERMINING MEMBERSHIP ON THE COMMITTEE ON LEGAL SERVICES PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-3-502 (3), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE ON CIVIL JUSTICE AND JUDICIARY SHALL BE CONSIDERED THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY.
- (a.3) ANY REFERENCE IN THESE RULES, THE JOINT RULES OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, OR IN THE COLORADO REVISED STATUTES, PRIOR TO JANUARY 1, 2001, TO THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE SHALL BE DEEMED TO REFER TO THE CIVIL JUSTICE AND JUDICIARY COMMITTEE; EXCEPT THAT ANY REFERENCE IN ARTICLE 16 THROUGH 21, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES, TO THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE SHALL BE DEEMED TO REFER TO THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE.

- (g) All other committees shall consist of not less than ~~ten~~ NINE nor more than nineteen members, as determined by the Speaker.
- (k) (1) The committees of reference as listed in subsection (a) of this rule shall be placed in the following categories for the purpose of scheduling meetings:

Category	Committee
1	Business Affairs and Labor. CIVIL JUSTICE AND Judiciary. CRIMINAL JUSTICE. State, Veterans, and Military Affairs.
2	Education. Health, Environment, Welfare, and Institutions. INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY. Local Government.
3	Agriculture, Livestock, and Natural Resources. Finance. Transportation and Energy.
4	Appropriations.
