#### **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 01-1013** 101 CONCERNING THE DESIGNATION OF THE BRIDGE ON STATE HIGHWAY 102 133 CROSSING THE ROARING FORK RIVER IN CARBONDALE, 103 COLORADO, AS THE "VETERANS' MEMORIAL BRIDGE".
