

**JBC STAFF FISCAL ANALYSIS
HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE**

CONCERNING PERMITS THAT AUTHORIZE CARRYING OF CONCEALED HANDGUNS IN AREAS OTHER THAN PUBLIC KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELFTH-GRADE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTS ISSUED TO PERSONS WITH HANDGUN TRAINING WHO PASS BACKGROUND CHECKS THAT INCLUDE FINGERPRINTING TO ENSURE SUCH PERSONS ARE NOT A DANGER, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, IDENTIFYING THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS THAT AUTHORIZE CARRYING OF CONCEALED HANDGUNS AS AN ISSUE OF STATEWIDE CONCERN AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

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Summary of Amendments Made to the Bill After the 04/03/02 Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note was Prepared (Amended by the House Civil Justice & Judiciary Committee 04/05/02)

1. Amends the printed bill to include a provision indicating that if a sheriff suspends or revokes a permit, the permit holder may seek a review of the decision and submit additional information for the record.
2. Adds birth date and previous names to the permit application form.
3. Requires that a sheriff, after receiving a permit application, consult with municipal police departments.
4. Deletes the requirement that the Colorado Bureau of Investigation destroy fingerprints received from a sheriff as part of the application process.
5. Deletes the provision requiring the sheriff to take two sets of an applicant's fingerprints upon the receipt of permit renewal documents.
6. Stipulates that any permit to carry a concealed weapon that is issued in another state shall be valid in Colorado for 90 days.
7. Provides that any person seeking a renewal of a permit not be required to submit new fingerprints if the Colorado Bureau of Investigation has at least one set on file.

These amendments do not change the fiscal impact of the bill.

Amendments/Appropriation Status

The bill currently contains an appropriations clause for \$332,846 cash funds (from permit application fees) and 3.4 FTE. However, as detailed in the Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note dated April 3, 2002, the bill has a fiscal impact of \$360,671 cash funds, \$424,600 cash funds exempt and 3.4 FTE. The cash funds spending authority will enable the Department of Public Safety to collect the necessary fees provided in the bill. The cash funds exempt spending authority is to allow the Department of Public Safety to collect and forward the FBI fingerprint fee to the federal government. **Staff has prepared J.001 which amends the current appropriation clause to include the amounts outlined in the Legislative Council Fiscal Note.**
