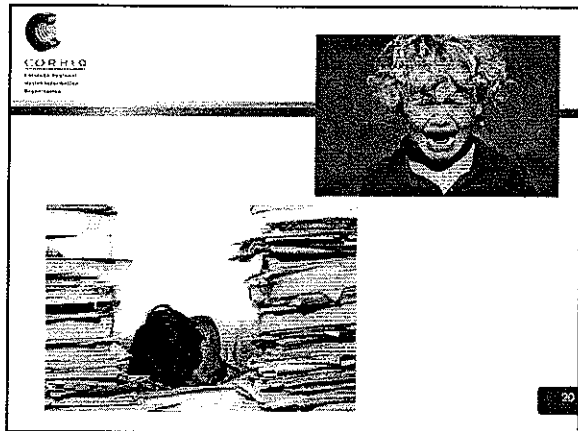
Stage	Description	2007	2008
Stage 7	Medical record fully electronic; HCO able to contribute CCD as byproduct of EMR; Data synchronization/testing	0.00%	0.30%
Stage 6	Physician documentation (structured templates), full CDSS (evidence & compliance), full R-PACS	0.30%	0.50%
Stage 5	Closed loop medication administration	1.90%	2.50%
Stage 4	CPOE, Clinical Decision Support (clinical protocols)	2.20%	2.50%
Stage 3	Clinical documentation (flow sheets), CDSS (error checking), PACS (native outside facility)	25.10%	26.50%
Stage 2	Clinical Data Repository, Controlled Medical Vocabulary, CDSS inference engine, may allow Document Imaging	37.20%	31.50%
Stage 1	Ancillaries- Lab, Rad, Pharmacy - All Installed	14.00%	11.50%
Stage 0	All Three Ancillaries NOT Installed	19.30%	15.80%
