



COHELP Colorado Health Emergency Line for the Public 1-877-462-2911

COHELP is a toll-free phone information line for the public that is available to answer health questions. Information is provided to COHELP by experts at the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. COHELP is part of the Rocky Mountain Poison & Drug Center (RMPDC) and was developed to provide consistent, accurate and up-to-date information to the state's public and providers. It also serves as a way to gather statewide data on public health issues. In emergency events, the service hours can be adjusted to meet public needs.

Hours of Operation: COHELP is currently staffed from 6:00am to 10:00pm (starting April 26, 2009) to disseminate health information on swine flu. The information will be updated as the situation changes. Recorded information is also available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Staffing: COHELP is staffed with information specialists at RMPDC. It uses telephones and web-based technology to deliver information on:

- Develop capability and capacity to adapt to other public health emergencies
