Dear Members of the Senate Health and Human Services Committee:

The Legal Center for People with Disabilities (the designated Protection and Advocacy agency for the State of Colorado) opposes SB09-134. I request that the following information be read into the record during the hearing of this Bill:

- ➤ This Bill provides no perimeters as to the number of allowable "homes" within the "compound" boundaries. This lack of limits on the number of people residing within a "compound" could allow for the creation of the large congregate residential settings our State has worked so hard to reduce.
- Dur Medicaid waivers mandate the "assurance of community inclusion". Thus a segregated and rural compound would not meet the important waiver mandate of inclusivity. The integrity of community acceptance and inclusion of individuals with disabilities is at stake should a segregated residential model become an option within the States current waiver scheme.
- > Our State should focus not just on people being in the community but on being **part** of the community.
- ➤ Giving society a chance to know and respect individuals with disabilities will diminish the fears and myths that once caused society to segregate them. People with disabilities need an integrated place to be; opportunities for community participation; meaningful relationships; and community acceptance.
