Fiscal Assessment of Proposed Amendment HB1064 L.001.

This memorandum is an assessment of the fiscal impact of the attached proposed amendment to **HB09-1064**. This fiscal assessment is for the impact of the bill with inclusion of this amendment <u>only</u>. Any other added amendment could influence the fiscal impact.

Summary of Proposed Amendment

The proposed amendment requires the task force to meet during the interim, removes the requirement that the state demographer provide data and assistance to the task force, and specifies that all public and private moneys donated for the purposes of the task force's work shall be continuously appropriated.

Fiscal Impact of Amendment

Amendment L.001 reduces the General Fund impact as identified in the fiscal note dated January 15, 2009, by \$20,508 and 0.4 FTE in FY 2009-10. The amendment eliminates any expenditures by the state demographer in the Department of Local Affairs.
