Help America Vote Act (HAVA)

Background

- Congress created the 2002 Help America Vote Act (HAVA) in response to problems with the 2000 presidential election. HAVA's goals are to improve the administration of federal elections by creating a computerized statewide voter registration system; replacing punch-card ballots and lever voting machines; ensuring accessibility for disabled voters; and adopting new rules for provisional ballots.
- HAVA mandated a greater role for state government and the Secretary of State in an effort to more uniformly and effectively implement federal election laws [see Section 1-1.5-101 (1) (g), C.R.S.].

HAVA Funds

- ☐ In 2003, the General Assembly created the Federal Elections Assistance Fund to receive federal and state monies appropriated for HAVA-related purposes (see Section 1-1.5-106, C.R.S.).
- To date, Colorado has received approximately \$43.3 million in federal funds, has earned an additional \$5 million in interest, and has provided a state match of \$1.9 million from the Department of State cash fund.
- Monies in the Federal Elections Assistance Fund may only be used for HAVA-specified purposes and are continuously appropriated to the Department for the administration, implementation, and enforcement of HAVA [see Section 1-1.5-106 (2), C.R.S.].
- HAVA funds will be exhausted by the end of FY 2010-11. When this occurs, the Department will require an additional \$2.7 million annually to remain compliant with HAVA.

Election-related Spending

- The Department's election-related spending varies depending upon whether it is an even- or odd-year election.
- Many of the election-related expenditures are not labeled as such in the Long Bill. They are contained in line items such as Personal Services and Operating Expenses. Only three line items HAVA, Initiative and Referendum, and Local Election Reimbursement pertain solely to elections.
- The Local Election Reimbursement line item reimburses counties for the cost of having statewide ballot initiatives on the ballot. Counties receive between \$0.70 and \$0.80 per registered voter, depending upon the number of registered voters at the time of the election.
- The Initiative and Referendum line item represents the Department's costs for processing initiatives that are submitted for signature verification and placement on the ballot.
- HAVA expenditures will decrease significantly starting in FY 2009-10. The Department estimates that it will require \$2.3 million in HAVA funds.
- The numbers below represent the costs that the Department incurs to administer elections, certify voting equipment, ensure HAVA compliance, implement the statewide voter registration database, and provide technical support to the counties. Due to the cyclical nature of election costs, as well as fluctuations in HAVA spending, the numbers below do not represent the Department's complete or ongoing election-related spending. They are a one-time snapshot of certain appropriations in the Department's section of the FY 2008-09 Long Bill.
