SUBJECT:

Overview of the Water Resources Review Committee

This memorandum describes the Water Resources Review Committee's membership, charge, bill limits, and bill request deadlines. Table 1also summarizes the committee's activities since 2004 including the number of meetings, tours, and legislative recommendations. Final reports, memorandum, and other information from previous years are available on the General Assembly's website.¹

Membership requirements. The Water Resources Review Committee is a ten-member committee with terms extending from January 1 of an odd-numbered year to December 31 of the following even-numbered year (two years). During odd-numbered years, the President appoints the chair and the Speaker appoints the vice-chair. Members are appointed according to the following criteria:

- five Senate members, three appointed by the Senate President and two appointed by the Senate Minority Leader;
- five House members appointed by the House Speaker in consultation with the House Minority Leader;
- at least four members must reside west of the Continental Divide or their district must have a majority of its population residing west of the Continental Divide; and
- members should represent each of the seven water divisions.

Committee charge. The committee is authorized to review water issues and propose legislation related to the conservation, use, development, and financing of Colorado's water resources. In conducting its review, the committee is required to consult with experts in the field of water conservation, quality, use, finance, and development.

Tours and meetings. The committee is authorized to meet up to eight times during odd-numbered years and to take up to two field trips.³

Committee Recommendations to Legislative Council

Bill limits. Each bill recommended by the committee must be approved by a two-thirds vote. The committee is limited to recommending three bills to the Legislative Council, unless two-thirds of the members of the Water Resources Review Committee vote to recommend a greater number.⁴ The Joint Rules of the House and Senate limit to eight the total number of bills that may be recommended by any committee unless the Executive Committee of the Legislative Council approves a greater number.⁵

Legislative Council review. The Legislative Council will review interim committee recommendations on November 13, 2009.⁶ Bills approved by the Legislative Council do not count against a member's five bill limit for the regular legislative session.⁷ Bills not approved by Legislative Council may be introduced into the regular session but such bills will count against a member's five bill limit. Interim committee bills must have prime sponsors prior to consideration by the Legislative Council.⁸

Legislative Council's requirements for bill drafts. Legislative Council typically issues guidelines for interim committees that require that at least a majority of the committee membership approve a bill in concept prior to requesting a bill draft. Requests must also be made at least two weeks before the final meeting to allow sufficient time for drafting and final consideration by the committee. In keeping with this practice, bills must be approved by the committee by Friday, October 30, 2009, to be considered at the November 13, 2009, meeting of the Legislative Council.
