SHORT TITLE: "Higher Ed Capital Construction Approval"

A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE PROCESS FOR APPROVING CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION
102 PROJECTS AT STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Capital Development Committee. Requires the Colorado commission on higher education (commission) to review each capital construction project (project) at a state institution of higher education (institution) that is estimated to cost more than \$2 million and that is constructed, operated, and maintained using moneys other than state general fund or student tuition moneys. Instructs the commission to hold a public hearing. Requires the institution to notify certain members of the

general assembly prior to the hearing. Directs the commission to approve the project if it meets specified conditions. Authorizes the institution to proceed with the project once approved by the commission.

Requires the commission to review any project at an institution that is estimated to cost more than \$2 million and that is constructed using moneys other than state general fund or student tuition moneys but may be operated or maintained using state general fund or student tuition moneys. Instructs the commission to hold a public hearing. Requires the institution to notify certain members of the general assembly prior to the hearing. Directs the commission to approve the project if it meets specified conditions. Directs the commission to refer approved projects simultaneously to the capital development committee (CDC) and the joint budget committee (JBC) of the general assembly. Authorizes the institution to proceed with the project once approved by the commission, the CDC, and the JBC.

Includes projects with an estimated cost of over \$2 million that do not require approval of the CDC or JBC within the list of projects required to be reported by the institution to the commission and by the commission to the general assembly.

2 **SECTION 1.** 23-1-106 (5) (a), (9), (10), and (11), Colorado Revised Statutes, are amended to read:

23-1-106. Duties and powers of the commission with respect to capital construction and long-range planning. (5) (a) The commission shall approve plans for any capital construction project at any institution, including a community college , regardless of the source of funds; except that the commission need not approve plans for any capital construction project at a local district college or area vocational school or for any capital construction project described in subsection (9) or (10) of this section ESTIMATED TO REQUIRE TOTAL EXPENDITURES OF TWO MILLION DOLLARS OR LESS THAT IS TO BE CONSTRUCTED USING MONEYS HELD BY THE INSTITUTION OTHER THAN STATE GENERAL FUND MONEYS OR STUDENT TUITION MONEYS.

(9) (a) The commission shall review and approve any plan for a
capital construction project that is estimated to require total expenditures
exceeding two million dollars and that is to be constructed, operated, and
maintained solely from student fees, auxiliary facility funds, wholly
endowed gifts and bequests, research building revolving funds, or a
combination of such sources, as provided in sections 23-5-102, 23-5-103,
23-5-112, 23-20-124, 23-31-129, and 23-41-117 and section 24-75-303
(3), C.R.S. MONEYS HELD BY THE STATE-SUPPORTED INSTITUTION OF
HIGHER EDUCATION OTHER THAN STATE GENERAL FUND MONEYS OR
STUDENT TUITION MONEYS. Any such plan for a capital construction
project that is estimated to require total expenditures of two million
dollars or less shall not be subject to review or approval by the
commission.

- (b) Upon approval of a plan for a capital construction project pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subsection (9), the commission shall submit such plan to the capital development committee. The capital development committee shall make a recommendation regarding the project to the joint budget committee. Following receipt of the recommendation, the joint budget committee shall refer its recommendations regarding the project, with written comments, to the commission. The COMMISSION SHALL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING PRIOR TO APPROVING A PROJECT PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (9). PRIOR TO THE HEARING, THE STATE-SUPPORTED INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL NOTIFY ALL MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY WHO REPRESENT THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE INSTITUTION IS LOCATED.
- (c) (I) The commission, the capital development committee, and the joint budget committee shall by agreement adopt procedures

- review of projects subject to this subsection (9) and subsection (10) of this section, which agreement shall provide that, whenever possible, the capital development committee shall submit recommendations to the joint budget committee shall submit recommendations to the joint budget committee shall submit recommendations to the commission within thirty days after each committee receives the information prescribed in the agreement as necessary for its review. - (C) If there is any public opposition to the project, the institution has considered the opposition, but determined the project is in the best interests of the institution.
- (II) ONCE APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (9), THE INSTITUTION MAY PROCEED WITH THE PROJECT.
- (d) It is the intent of the general assembly that a project approved by the commission pursuant to this subsection (9) shall not be eligible for any state general fund moneys or student tuition moneys to pay for construction, operation, or

(10) (a) The commission shall review and approve any plan for a
capital construction project that is estimated to require total expenditures
exceeding two million dollars and that is to be constructed solely from

- (III) IF THERE IS ANY PUBLIC OPPOSITION TO THE PROJECT, THE INSTITUTION HAS CONSIDERED THE OPPOSITION, BUT HAS DETERMINED THE PROJECT IS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE INSTITUTION.
- (b) Upon approval of a plan for a capital construction project pursuant to paragraph (a) (a.7) of this subsection (10), the commission shall submit the plan SIMULTANEOUSLY to BOTH the capital development committee AND THE JOINT BUDGET COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY. AFTER THE PROJECT IS APPROVED BY BOTH the capital development committee shall make a recommendation regarding the project to the joint budget committee. Following the receipt of the recommendation, AND the joint budget committee, shall refer its recommendations regarding the project, with written comments, to the commission THE INSTITUTION MAY PROCEED WITH THE PROJECT.
- (c) The commission, the capital development committee, and the joint budget committee shall by agreement adopt procedures governing the capital development committee and joint budget committee review of projects subject to this subsection (10), which agreement shall provide that, whenever possible, the capital development committee and the joint budget committee shall submit recommendations to the commission within thirty days after each committee receives the information prescribed in the agreement as necessary for its review.

 - (I) The project is to be constructed solely from cash funds MONEYS held by the institution other than those funds specified in subparagraph (II) of this paragraph (a) STATE GENERAL FUND MONEYS OR STUDENT TUITION MONEYS and is to be operated and maintained SOLELY from such cash funds or from state moneys appropriated for such purpose, or both, HELD BY THE INSTITUTION OTHER THAN STATE GENERAL FUND MONEYS OR STUDENT TUITION MONEYS and the plan for the project has been approved by the Colorado commission on higher education pursuant to section 23-1-106 (10) 23-1-106 (9), C.R.S.; or
