#### **COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE REPORTS**

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that **HB04-1062** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend reengrossed bill, page 12, strike lines 8 through 20 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 6. Effective date - applicability. (1) This act shall take effect January 1, 2005.

(2) However, if a referendum petition is filed against this act or an item, section, or part of this act during the 90-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly that is allowed for submitting a referendum petition pursuant to article V, section 1 (3) of the state constitution, then the act, item, section, or part, shall not take effect unless approved by the people at a biennial regular general election and shall take effect on the date specified in subsection (1) or on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by proclamation of the governor, whichever is later.

(3) The provisions of this act shall apply to abandoned motor vehicles taken to repair shops on or after the applicable effective date of this act.".

On motion of Senator Hillman, and with a majority of those elected to the Senate having voted in the affirmative, the balance of the calendar of March 17, 2004, was laid over until Thursday, March 18, 2004, retaining its place on the calendar.
