- Conferences with an attorney for the public body concerning disputes involving the public body that are the subject of pending or imminent court action;
- Matters required to be kept confidential by federal law or rules or state statutes;
- (d) Specialized details of security arrangements where disclosure of the matters discussed might reveal information that could be used for the purpose of committing, or avoiding prosecution for, a violation of the law;
- To determine positions relative to matters that may be subject to (e) negotiations with employees or employee organizations; to develop strategy for and receive reports on the progress negotiations, and to instruct negotiators;
- (f) All meetings held by members of a public body subject to this part 4 to consider the appointment or employment of a public official or employee or the dismissal, discipline, promotion, demotion, or compensation of, or the investigation of charges or complaints

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against, a public official or employee shall be open to the public unless said applicant, official, or employee requests an executive session. An executive session may be held only at a regular or special meeting of the public body and only upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the entire membership of the body;

Prior to the time the members of the public body convene in executive session, the chairman of the body shall announce the general topic of the executive session as enumerated in subsections (a) and (f) of this section.

The staff of such committee shall maintain topical minutes of any session held under the provisions of this Joint Rule. ANY EXECUTIVE SESSION SHALL BE HELD IN ACCORDANCE WITH PART 4 OF ARTICLE 6 OF TITLE 24, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES.".
