COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE REPORTS

Appropriations

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that **HB04-1265** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend reengrossed bill, page 4, line 15, strike "three hundred" and substitute the following:

"two hundred fifty-nine thousand two hundred seventy-four dollars (\$259,274) and 2.3 FTE. Of said sum, one hundred twelve thousand four hundred fifteen dollars (\$112,415) shall be from the general fund and one hundred forty-six thousand eight hundred fifty-nine dollars (\$146,859) shall be from federal funds.";

strike lines 16 through 20;

strike lines 23 through 27, and substitute the following:

"decreased by two hundred fifty-nine thousand two hundred seventy-four dollars (\$259,274). Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, line 1, strike "amended" and substitute "repealed";

- (b) (I) On July 1, 2004, the state treasurer and the controller shall transfer an amount equal to one hundred thirty-eight million two hundred thousand dollars from the general fund to the trust fund.
- (II) On July 1, 2005, the state treasurer and the controller shall transfer an amount equal to one hundred thirty-eight million two hundred thousand dollars from the general fund to the trust fund.

"SECTION 5. Appropriation - adjustments to 2004 long bill. (1) For the implementation of this act, appropriations made in the annual general appropriation act to the department of health care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, shall be adjusted as follows:

- (a) The appropriation to the executive director's office, for personal services, is increased by seventeen thousand three hundred twenty-four dollars (\$17,324) and 0.3 FTE. Of said sum, eight thousand six hundred sixty-two dollars (\$8,662) shall be from the Colorado autism treatment fund, created in section 26-4-695, Colorado Revised Statutes, and eight thousand six hundred and sixty-two dollars (\$8,662) shall be from federal funds.
- (b) The appropriation to the executive director's office, for operating expenses, is increased by three thousand nine hundred sixteen dollars (\$3,916). Of said sum, one thousand nine hundred fifty-eight dollars (\$1,958) shall be from the Colorado autism treatment fund, created in section 26-4-695, Colorado Revised Statutes, and one thousand nine hundred fifty eight dollars (\$1,958) shall be from federal funds.
- (c) The appropriation to the executive director's office, for the medicaid management information system contract, is increased by seventy-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$72,500). Of said sum, eighteen thousand one hundred twenty-five (\$18,125) shall be from the Colorado autism treatment fund, created in section 26-4-695, Colorado Revised Statutes, and fifty-four thousand three hundred seventy-five dollars (\$54,375) shall be from federal funds.
- (d) The appropriation for the department of human services medicaid-funded programs, office of technology services medicaid funding, Colorado benefits management system, is increased by twenty-nine thousand nine hundred dollars (\$29,900). Of said sum, fourteen thousand nine hundred fifty (\$14,950) shall be from the Colorado autism treatment fund, created in section 26-4-695, Colorado Revised Statutes, and fourteen thousand nine hundred fifty dollars (\$14,950) shall be from federal funds.
- (2) For the implementation of this act, the appropriations made in the annual general appropriation act to the department of human services, office of information technology services, for the Colorado benefit management system (CBMS), shall be increased by twenty-nine thousand nine hundred dollars (\$29,900). Said sum shall be from cash funds exempt received from the department of health care policy and

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financing out of the appropriations made in subsection (1) of this section.

SECTION 6. Effective date. (1) This act shall take effect January 1, 2005.

(2) However, if a referendum petition is filed against this act or an item, section, or part of this act during the 90-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly that is allowed for submitting a referendum petition pursuant to article V, section 1 (3) of the state constitution, then the act, item, section, or part, shall not take effect unless approved by the people at a biennial regular general election and shall take effect on the date specified in subsection (1) or on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by proclamation of the governor, whichever is later."
