THIS REPORT AMENDS THE
REREVISED BILL

To the President of the Senate and the
Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Your first conference committee appointed on HB04-1102, concerning the regulation of dental health care providers by the state board of dental examiners, has met and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

That the House accede to the Senate amendments made to the bill as said amendments appear in the rerevised bill, with the following changes:

Amend rerevised bill, page 9, line 5, strike "2019." and substitute "2014."

Page 65, strike lines 18 through 24 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 6. 24-34-104 (45), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies and functions for termination, continuation, or reestablishment. (45) The following agencies, functions, or both, shall terminate on July 1, 2014:

(a) The accreditation of health care providers under the workers' compensation system in accordance with section 8-42-101 (3.5) and (3.6), C.R.S.

(b) THE STATE BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS, CREATED BY ARTICLE 35 OF TITLE 12, C.R.S."
