(c) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (4), FOR THE 2004-05, 2005-06, AND 2006-07 BUDGET YEARS, IF THE DISTRICT PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS IS EQUAL TO OR LESS THAN THE STATEWIDE AVERAGE PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS OR THE DISTRICT'S FUNDED PUPIL COUNT IS EQUAL TO OR LESS THAN FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE, THE FORMULA SHALL BE:

(DISTRICT PER PUPIL FUNDING X 11%) X DISTRICT AT-RISK PUPILS

(d) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (4), FOR THE 2004-05, 2005-06, AND 2006-07 BUDGET YEARS, IF THE DISTRICT PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS IS GREATER THAN THE STATEWIDE AVERAGE PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS AND THE DISTRICT'S FUNDED PUPIL COUNT IS GREATER THAN FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE, THE FORMULA SHALL BE:

SECTION 5. 22-54-104 (5) (f), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

22-54-104. District total program. (5) For purposes of the formulas used in this section:

(f) (I) If the district percentage of at-risk pupils is greater than the statewide average percentage of at-risk pupils and the district's funded pupil count is greater than four hundred fifty-nine but not in excess of fifty thousand, the district's at-risk factor shall be 11.5% plus a 0.30 percentage point for each percentage point that the district percentage of at-risk pupils exceeds the statewide average percentage of at-risk pupils; except that no district's at-risk factor shall exceed 30%. NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (I), FOR THE 2004-05, 2005-06, AND 2006-07 BUDGET YEARS, IF THE DISTRICT PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS IS GREATER THAN THE STATEWIDE AVERAGE PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS AND THE DISTRICT'S FUNDED PUPIL COUNT IS GREATER THAN FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE BUT NOT IN EXCESS OF FIFTY THOUSAND, THE DISTRICT'S AT-RISK FACTOR SHALL BE $11\%\,$ plus a $0.30\,$ percentage point for each percentage point that THE DISTRICT PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS EXCEEDS THE STATEWIDE AVERAGE PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS; EXCEPT THAT NO DISTRICT'S AT-RISK FACTOR SHALL EXCEED 30%.

(II) If the district percentage of at-risk pupils is greater than the statewide average percentage of at-risk pupils and the district's funded pupil count is greater than fifty thousand, the district's at-risk factor shall be 11.5% plus a 0.36 percentage point for each percentage point that the district percentage of at-risk pupils exceeds the statewide average percentage of at-risk pupils; except that no district's at-risk factor shall exceed 30%.
