COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE REPORTS

Health, Environment, Welfare, & Institutions

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that SB04-095 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend printed bill, page 3, strike lines 14 and 15 and substitute the following:

"SECTION 3. Effective date - applicability. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004, and shall apply to stillbirths occurring prior to, on, or after said date.".

Health, Environment, Welfare, & Institutions

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that SB04-103 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee on State, Veterans, and Military Affairs with favorable recommendation.

Amend printed bill, page 3, strike lines 4 and 5 and substitute the following:

"SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL MEET THE CRITERIA SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (7) OF THIS SECTION.";

line 6, strike "JANUARY 1, 2005," and substitute "THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION,";

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line 8, strike "NONHEALTHFUL";

line 9, strike "NONHEALTHFUL";

strike line 14 and substitute the following:

"SALE OF FOODS AND BEVERAGES WHICH MEET THE CRITERIA SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (7) OF THIS SECTION.";

strike lines 15 through 25 and substitute the following:

"(4) A SCHOOL SHALL REPORT TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT ANY VIOLATIONS OF THIS SECTION OR OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT POLICY ADOPTED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL REPORT SAID VIOLATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL PAY TO THE STATE TREASURER AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE ESTIMATED PROFITS ATTRIBUTABLE TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT FROM THE SALES IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION OR THE SCHOOL DISTRICT POLICY. THE STATE TREASURER SHALL CREDIT THE AMOUNT TO THE".

Page 5, strike lines 6 through 12 and substitute the following:

"(7) (a) FOODS AND BEVERAGES SOLD THROUGH SCHOOL VENDING MACHINES THAT MEET ACCEPTABLE NUTRITIONAL STANDARDS SHALL CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING:";

line 20, strike "AND";

line 23, strike the period and substitute a semicolon;

strike line 24;

line 25, strike "(I)" and substitute "(V)".

Page 6, strike "(II)" and substitute "(VI)";

after line 6, insert the following:

"(b) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "ADDITIONAL SWEETENER" MEANS AN ADDITIVE THAT ENHANCES THE SWEETNESS OF A FOOD OR BEVERAGE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO SUGAR. "ADDITIONAL SWEETENER" DOES NOT INCLUDE THE NATURAL SUGAR OR SUGARS THAT ARE CONTAINED IN ANY FRUIT JUICE THAT IS A COMPONENT OF THE FOOD OR BEVERAGE.".

The court may punish a violation of a protective order by contempt of court.

(b) THE VICTIM WHO WOULD BE THE SUBJECT OF THE PROTECTIVE ORDER MAY OBJECT TO THE MOTION FOR A PROTECTIVE ORDER.".

Page 3, line 12, strike "A" and substitute "AN ACTION CONCERNING" and, strike "CUSTODY, OR VISITATION" and substitute "ALLOCATION OF PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES, OR PARENTING TIME,";

line 13, strike "ACTION,";

line 14, after "THE", insert "ACTION CONCERNING" and, strike "CUSTODY, OR" and substitute "ALLOCATION OF PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES, OR PARENTING TIME.";

strike line 15.
