(c) Have a formal accounting of limited liability company affairs whenever circumstances render it just and reasonable.";

line 11, strike "is" and substitute "are";

after line 17, insert the following:

"(2) If the limited liability company does not correct each ground for dissolution, or demonstrate to the reasonable satisfaction of the secretary of state that each ground determined by the secretary of state does not exist, within sixty days after mailing DELIVERY of the notice contemplated in subsection (1) of this section, the secretary of state may administratively dissolve the limited liability company. The secretary of state shall mail DELIVER written notice of the administrative dissolution, stating the effective date thereof, to the principal office address of the dissolved limited liability company's principal office and shall mail DELIVER a copy of such THE notice to the registered agent address of the dissolved limited liability company's last registered agent.".
