after line 3, insert the following:

"strike lines 19 through 21 and substitute the following:

"CERTIFIED INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST OR AN INDUSTRIAL HYGIENIST AS DEFINED BY SECTION 24-30-1402, C.R.S., AND AS EVIDENCED BY A COPY OF THE RESULTS PROVIDED TO THE GOVERNING BODY, OR HAS DEMOLISHED THE PROPERTY, COMPLIANCE WITH THE STANDARDS SHALL";

line 24, strike "PROPERTY" and substitute "PROPERTY, OR A NEIGHBOR OF SUCH PROPERTY,";

line 25, after "INJURY", insert "OR LOSS".".

Education After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that **HB04-1037** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, strike lines 7 through 11 and substitute the following:

"(a) "AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE" MEANS THE NATURAL LANGUAGE RECOGNIZED GLOBALLY THAT IS USED BY MEMBERS OF THE DEAF COMMUNITY AND THAT IS LINGUISTICALLY COMPLETE WITH UNIQUE RULES FOR LANGUAGE STRUCTURE AND USE, THAT INCLUDE PHONOLOGY, MORPHOLOGY, SYNTAX, SEMANTICS, AND DISCOURSE.".

Page 3, line 23, strike "COURSES; AND" and substitute "COURSES, EXCEPT THOSE REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO THE CONTENT OF THE ACADEMIC MAJOR; AND".

Page 4, strike lines 7 through 11 and substitute the following:

"(a) "AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE" MEANS THE NATURAL LANGUAGE RECOGNIZED GLOBALLY THAT IS USED BY MEMBERS OF THE DEAF COMMUNITY AND THAT IS LINGUISTICALLY COMPLETE WITH UNIQUE RULES FOR LANGUAGE STRUCTURE AND USE, THAT INCLUDE PHONOLOGY, MORPHOLOGY, SYNTAX, SEMANTICS, AND DISCOURSE.".

Education After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that **HB04-1137** be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, line 16, after the period, add "THE SCHOOL SHALL BE DEEMED TO HAVE MADE A REASONABLE ATTEMPT TO CONTACT THE PARENT, GUARDIAN, OR LEGAL OR PHYSICAL CUSTODIAN IF THE SCHOOL CALLS EACH OF THE PHONE NUMBERS THE PARENT, GUARDIAN, OR LEGAL OR PHYSICAL CUSTODIAN PROVIDES TO THE SCHOOL AND ALL PHONE NUMBERS THE STUDENT PROVIDES TO THE SCHOOL FOR THE PARENT, GUARDIAN, OR LEGAL OR PHYSICAL CUSTODIAN.".

Education After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that **HB04-1194** be referred 60 to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation. 61
