- (C) A written statement by the assessor of the county where the property is located, dated no more than six months prior to the date of filing of the notice of election and demand or lis pendens with the officer, that any portion of the property was valued and assessed as other than agricultural property after the date of the recording of the deed of trust or as of the date of the statement.
 - (I.5) THE OFFICER SHALL ACCEPT, AS EVIDENCE THAT THE

PROPERTY IS AGRICULTURAL PROPERTY, A WRITTEN STATEMENT BY THE ASSESSOR OF THE COUNTY WHERE THE PROPERTY IS LOCATED, DATED NO MORE THAN SIX MONTHS BEFORE THE DATE OF FILING OF THE NOTICE OF 4 ELECTION AND DEMAND OR LIS PENDENS WITH THE OFFICER, THAT ALL OF THE PROPERTY WAS VALUED AND ASSESSED AS AGRICULTURAL PROPERTY AFTER THE DATE OF THE RECORDING OF THE DEED OF TRUST OR AS OF THE DATE OF THE STATEMENT.
