43 (B) ONE MEMBER WHO IS EITHER A LICENSED PHARMACEUTICAL

 45 AT LEAST FIVE YEARS' EXPERIENCE IN THIS STATE, IN GOOD STANDING, AND  
 46 ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN THE PRACTICE OF WHOLESALE PHARMACY OR A  
 47 LICENSED VETERINARIAN, HAVING AT LEAST FIVE YEARS' EXPERIENCE IN  
 48 THIS STATE, IN GOOD STANDING, AND ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN THE  
 49 PRACTICE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE, BUT WHO IS NOT BOTH A  
 50 PHARMACEUTICAL WHOLESALER AND A VETERINARIAN; AND

51 (C) ONE MEMBER WHO HAS A BACKGROUND IN AGRICULTURE AND  
 52 WHO IS NOT A PHARMACIST, PHARMACEUTICAL WHOLESALER, OR  
 53 VETERINARIAN.

54 (II) THE STATE VETERINARIAN SHALL CHOOSE A PERSON WHO DOES  
 55 NOT DO BUSINESS ALONG THE FRONT RANGE FOR AT LEAST ONE OF THE  
 56 PROFESSIONAL APPOINTMENTS ON THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.



1 (b) THE MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SERVE  
2 THREE-YEAR TERMS; EXCEPT THAT THE STATE VETERINARIAN SHALL  
3 APPOINT ONE OF THE INITIAL MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR  
4 A TWO-YEAR TERM. IF THERE IS A VACANCY ON THE ADVISORY  
5 COMMITTEE, THE STATE VETERINARIAN SHALL APPOINT A SUCCESSOR TO
