APPROPRIATIONS

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

HB16-1060 be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

HB16-1070 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

Amend printed bill, page 6, after line 13 insert:

"SECTION 4. Appropriation. For the 2016-17 state fiscal year, \$15,450 is appropriated to the department of state for use by the information technology services division. This appropriation is from the department of state cash fund created in section 24-21-104 (3) (b), C.R.S. To implement this act, the division may use this appropriation for personal services."

Renumber succeeding section accordingly.

Page 1, line 102, strike "ELECTIONS." and substitute "ELECTIONS, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION."

HB16-1103 be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

HB16-1141 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

Amend printed bill, page 4, after line 1 insert:

"SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-16-104.5, amend (1.7) (b) (II) as follows:

25-16-104.5. Solid waste user fee - imposed - rate - direction - legislative declaration - repeal. (1.7) (b) (II) The portions of the fee imposed under this subsection (1.7) that are collected for the costs described in subparagraphs (II) and (III) of paragraph (a) of this subsection (1.7) shall be transmitted to the department for deposit into the hazardous substance response fund created in section 25-16-104.6. The department may expend moneys MONEY from the portion of the fee collected under subparagraph (III) of paragraph (a) of this subsection (1.7) to compensate the department of law for all or a portion of the expenses incurred for services rendered under the federal act, as billed to
