SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 33-60-104, amend (1) as follows:

33-60-104. Distribution of net lottery proceeds beginning first quarter fiscal year 2013-2014. (1) For the first quarter of fiscal year 2013-2014 and for each quarter thereafter, the State Treasurer shall distribute net lottery proceeds as follows:

(a) FIFTY PERCENT TO THE VARIOUS SCHOOL DISTRICTS {HEREINAFTER THE "DISTRICT" OF THE STATE OF COLORADO, ON A PER CAPITA BASIS ACCORDING TO STUDENT ENROLLMENT IN EACH DISTRICT;

(b) THE DISTRICT SHALL DISTRIBUTE SAID FUNDS TO ALL PUBLIC AND CHARTER SCHOOLS WITHIN ITS THE JURISDICTION, K-12, FOR TEACHER SALARIES, EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES, AND INFRASTRUCTURE AS FOLLOWS:

a. TEACHER SALARIES SHALL BE, AT A MINIMUM, \$40,000.00 PER YEAR;

THE DISTRICT SHALL SET CLASSROOM SIZES AT A MAXIMUM OF TWENTY-FIVE [25];

c. FEES FOR "EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES" WITHIN THE DISTRICT SHALL BE A MAXIMUM OF \$25 PER STUDENT PER ACTIVITY PER SCHOOL YEAR:

d. "EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES" SHALL INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, ALL ACTIVITIES COVERED BY THE COLORADO HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION;

e. NO SCHOOL SHALL BE FORCED TO ADD AN "ACTIVITY" SOLELY BECAUSE FUNDS MAY BE AVAILABLE IF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT DEEMS IT WOULD BE BETTER SERVED USING FUNDS ELSEWHERE AS STATED ABOVE;

f. NO ACTIVITY SHALL BE ADDED IN CONTRAVENTION OF FEDERAL OR STATE LAW;

g. ANY REMAINING FUNDS, AFTER THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS ARE MET, MAY BE PUT IN TRUST BY THE DISTRICT FOR FUTURE USE.

(c) Forty-Twenty-Five percent to the conservation trust fund for distribution to municipalities and counties and other eligible entities for parks, recreation, and open space purposes;

(d) Ten percent to the division of parks and outdoor recreation for the acquisition, development, and improvement of new and existing state parks, recreation areas, and recreational trails; and

(e) All remaining net lottery proceeds in trust to the trust fund board; except that, in any state fiscal year in which the portion of net lottery proceeds which would otherwise be given in trust to the trust fund board exceeds the adjusted amount of thirty-five million dollars as determined by the state treasurer in accordance with subsection (2) of this section, the net lottery proceeds in excess of such adjusted amount shall be allocated to the general fund.



SECTION 1. In the constitution of the state of Colorado, article XXVII, amend

SECTION 3. Moneys allocated to Trust Fund. (1) Beginning with the 3 (1) (b) as follows: proceeds from the fourth quarter of the State's Fiscal Year 2013-2014, all proceeds from all programs, including Lotto and every other state-supervised lottery game operated under the authority of Article, XVIII, Section 2 of the Colorado Constitution, whether by the Colorado Lottery Commission or otherwise (such programs defined hereafter in this Article as "Lottery Programs"), net of prizes and expenses of the state lottery division and after sufficient amount of money has been reserved, as of the end of any fiscal quarter, to ensure the operation of the lottery for the ensuing fiscal quarter (such netted proceeds defined hereafter in this Article as "Net Proceeds") are set aside, allocated, allotted, and continuously appropriated as follows, and the Treasurer shall distribute such proceeds no less frequently than quarterly, as follows:

- (b) For each quarter including and after the first quarter of the State's Fiscal year
- (I) FIFTY PERCENT TO THE VARIOUS SCHOOL DISTRICTS {HEREINAFTER THE "DISTRICT" OF THE STATE OF COLORADO, ON A PER CAPITA BASIS ACCORDING TO STUDENT ENROLLMENT IN EACH DISTRICT:
- (A) THE DISTRICT SHALL DISTRIBUTE SAID FUNDS TO ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS WITHIN ITS JURISDICTION, K-12, FOR TEACHER SALARIES, EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES, AND INFRASTRUCTURE AS FOLLOWS:
 - (1) TEACHER SALARIES SHALL BE, AT A MINIMUM, \$40,000.00 PER
 - (2) THE DISTRICT SHALL SET CLASSROOM SIZES AT 25 STUDENTS;
 - (3) FEES FOR "EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES" WITHIN THE DISTRICT SHALL BE A MAXIMUM OF \$25 PER ACTIVITY PER STUDENT PER YEAR;
 - (4) "EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES" SHALL INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO ALL ACTIVITIES OVERSEEN BY THE COLORADO HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION;
 - (5) NO SCHOOL SHALL BE FORCED TO ADD AN "ACTIVITY" SOLELY BECAUSE FUNDS MAY BE AVAILABLE IF THE DISTRICT DEEMS FUNDS WOULD BE BETTER SERVED FOR OTHER PURPOSES LISTED
 - (6) NO ACTIVITY SHALL BE ADDED IN CONTRAVENTION OF STATE OR FEDERAL LAW:
 - (7) ANY REMAINING FUNDS, AFTER THE ABOVE REQUIREMENTS ARE MET, MAY BE PUT INTO TRUST BY THE DISTRICT FOR FUTURE
 - (II) Forty-Twenty-Five percent to the Conservation Trust Fund for distribution to municipalities and counties and other eligible entities for parks, recreation and open space purposes;
 - (III) Ten percent to the Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation for the acquisition, development and improvement of new and existing state parks, recreation areas and recreational trails, and
