TITLE: CONCERNING THE USE OF PHYSICAL FORCE AGAINST A PERSON WHO MAKES AN UNLAWFUL ENTRY INTO A PLACE OF BUSINESS.**Summary of Legislation**

This bill creates a presumption that an occupant of a place of business who uses deadly physical force against an intruder has a reasonable fear of imminent death or serious bodily injury to himself or herself or another person and thus, is immune from criminal prosecution for the use of such force. Under current law, this presumption applies only to occupants of a dwelling. The bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Judiciary Committee on February 6, 2008.

Assessment

While this bill may make cases more complicated due to the expansion of locations where an occupant may use deadly force, cases involving deadly force are infrequent and the increase in case complexity will only result in a minimal increase in the courts' workload. Thus, this bill will not affect state or local revenues or expenditures and is assessed as having no fiscal impact.
