A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING SUSPENSION OF PAYMENTS TO A MEMBER OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IN THE EVENT THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FAILS TO PASS BILLS CRITICAL TO FINANCING

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill suspends all compensation, reimbursement, or other payments of any kind to a member of the general assembly if the general assembly fails to present to the governor both the annual general appropriation act and the annual school finance act. If applicable, the pay is suspended as of the first day of the interim until such time the general assembly presents both such bills to the governor or December 1 of the same year, whichever is earlier.
