Summary of Legislation

This bill makes a private business, including a not-for-profit entity that conducts retail sales, liable for damages in a civil action if:

- the business prohibits firearms, whether concealed or open, in situations in which carrying firearms would otherwise be legal;
- the business does not employ at least one on-duty armed security officer for every 50 individuals present at the business; and
- a plaintiff incurs damages as a result of actions taken by another person, and the plaintiff could have defended against those actions with a firearm.

State Expenditures

The bill is likely to increase the number of civil action cases filed in trial courts, but the number of cases is expected to be minimal and will not require additional appropriations to the Judicial Branch.
