## **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill neither requires nor contains an appropriation clause for FY 2013-14. Moneys in the Wildfire Emergency Response Fund and in the Wildfire Preparedness Fund are continuously appropriated to the Department of Public Safety's Division of Fire Prevention and Control.

#### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**L.001** Bill Sponsor amendment **L.001** (attached) specifies that the \$500,000 transfer from insurance premium taxes to the Wildfire Emergency Response Fund in FY 2013-14 occur no later than July 1, 2013.

## **Points to Consider**

#### General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2013-14 based on the March 2013 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The budget package allocates all but approximately \$9.0 million of General Fund revenues projected to be available. Pursuant to S.B. 13-236, this \$9.0 million General Fund will be transferred to the Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) Construction Fund. This bill transfers \$500,000 in insurance premium taxes revenues for

FY 2013-14 that would otherwise be credited to the General Fund and thus will reduce the transfer to the CWCB Construction Fund by that amount.

# Background

The Legislative Council Staff Fisacal Note states that there is no dedicated source of funding for the Wildfire Emergency Response Fund (WERF) and that in 2002 and 2008, \$240,250 and \$250,000 were reappropriated to the WERF from the Disaster Emergency Fund and the Wildfire Preparedness Fund. In addition to these amounts, Section 24-33.5-706 (2) (b) (I), C.R.S., allowed the Governor to make a one-time transfer of up to \$600,000 from the Disaster Emergency Fund to the WERF and in FY 2012-13, as part of supplemental funding for the Department of Public Safety, \$608,200 General Fund was appropriated to the Division of Fire Prevention and Control to cover expenditures incurred by the WERF during the 2012 fire season.
