Summary of Legislation

This bill waives the requirement for persons with a permanently disability to verify their disability every three years in order to renew their identifying license plates and placards. These plates and placards allow holders to use reserved parking spaces. This bill also requires that a professional certify the permanent disability in writing.

State Expenditures

For the current fiscal year, FY 2012-13, this bill increases one-time expenditures by \$604, cash funds, within the Department of Revenue. These costs are associated with computer programming to the Colorado State Titling and Registration System to discontinue the three-year notification sent to people holding these plates or placards, and to allow authorized agents to renew the license plate and placard without verification of the permanent disability. Further, these notifications will no longer need to be sent, decreasing expenditures minimally. These costs can be addressed within existing appropriations.

Local Government Impact

For the current fiscal year and beyond, this bill will decrease local government expenditures by a minimal amount. This bill no longer requires county clerk offices to verify the status of an individual's disability, and thus reduces staff time dedicated to that purpose.
