Description of Amendments in This Packet

If the Committee adopts amendment L.007, amendment J.002 should be adopted, and amendment J.001 should <u>not</u> be adopted.

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$53,856 General Fund and 0.6 FTE to the Stroke and STEMI Heart Attack Designation line item in the Emergency Preparedness and Response Division in the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2013-14.

L.007 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment L.002 (attached) clarifies that members on the task force and advisory board will not receive reimbursement for expenses incurred by serving on the task

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force or advisory board. Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$41,402 General Fund and 0.6 FTE to the Stroke and STEMI Heart Attack Designation line item in the Emergency Preparedness and Response Division in the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2013-14.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2013-14 based on the March 2013 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The budget package allocates all but approximately \$9.0 million of General Fund revenues projected to be available. Pursuant to S.B. 13-236, this \$9.0 million General Fund will be transferred to the Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB) Construction Fund. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$53,856 for FY 2013-14 and thus will reduce the transfer to the CWCB Construction Fund by that amount.
