## **Summary of Legislation**

Under current law, a peace officer is prohibited from holding a Colorado liquor license. This bill removes that prohibition.

#### **State Revenue**

This bill may result in a minimal increase in revenue to the Liquor Enforcement Division and State Licensing Authority Cash Fund from fees for new licenses or ownership changes as peace officers become able to hold liquor licenses.

## **Local Government Impact**

This bill may result in a minimal increase in revenue to local licensing authorities from fees for new licenses or ownership changes as peace officers become able to hold liquor licenses.
