The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$364,915 General Fund to the Department of Local Affairs for FY 2015-16. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE. The moneys and FTE are to be used for the strategic planning group created in this bill tasked with investigating issues related to the increasing number of Coloradans age 50 and older.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2015-16 based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$18.5

million General Fund to be available to fund 2015 legislation. If the full \$18.5 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
