Dear Members of the General Assembly:

I am pleased to submit the Department of Regulatory Agencies' (DORA) 2019 Regulatory Agenda which details the new rules or amendments DORA expects to propose in the next calendar year, as well as the 2018 Regulatory Agenda Report which details the results of the past year's regulatory activity, in compliance with Colo. Rev. Stat. §2-7-203, as amended by House Bill 12-1008. The Department's 2019 Regulatory Agenda has also been submitted to the Colorado Secretary of State for publication in the Colorado Register, and will be posted to the DORA website.

Effective July 1, 2018, all permanent rules adopted by the Department, as reflected in the 2018 Regulatory Agenda Report, involved early stakeholder engagement, as described by the Department's procedures for public participation in rulemaking (available online at https://docs.google.com/document/d/11qtgOtTBVGhmLmjp1aJlxOL3c2mi4GHY65edB-jdGG8/edit?usp=sharing).
